The Southeastern Massachusetts Chapter had a good year in 1997. At the 1996 Annual Meeting, a full slate of Executive members was elected for the first time in 3 years. The 96-97 Executive Board has worked very hard to run the Chapter. Many long hours have been put in by a talented and dedicated group of people.

Financially, the Chapter is at its strongest point in its entire history. In October, \$5000.00 was invested in a certificate of Deposit. (see the treasurer's report on page 4). This is in sharp contrast from 3 years ago when we ended the month of November, 1994 with a balance of \$805.13. In addition, the Chapter has \$14,000 in a special account at the AMC Office in Boston.

Our Quarterly Social Events are been well attended this year and have made a nominal profit. many new members have attended this events and had an opportunity to learn new outdoor skills such as crosscountry skiing and winter hiking. These events also provide members with a chance to learn about the Southeastern Massachusetts Chapter.

The Chapter has continued to experience a steady Membership growth in 1997. We are projected to end 1997 with a 9 per growth rate and a total of 2557 members. Currently, we are about 1300 individual members and 538 Family Memberships representing approximately 2,400 members.

Our Chapter leaders have provided an excellent selection of activities and I'd like to thank all our leaders for all their hard work and outstanding efforts.

Finally, I would like to say I have enjoyed being Chapter Chair these past 3 years. It has been rewarding for me personally to work with Executive Board Members and all the Chapter Leaders . I encourage any member to get involved. It's well worth the effort!
