Apps: (Caution! Phones frequently die in winter. Always carry a hard copy map of where you are hiking!)

IHikeGPS – GPS mapping app using current USGS and Forest Service maps. Calculate bearings between two points on a map, record tracks and set routes and waypoints. Help can be a bit cryptic. Maps are free and up-to-date. App costs about \$5.

Gaia GPS - Route to GPS coordinates, share maps, tracks, and waypoints. \$20/yr basic membership Highly rated by hikers.

Avenza maps – app is free. Used to download the latest AMC maps identical to the ones included with the AMC White Mountain Guide. Can see where you are but more limited than the above apps. Each AMC map costs about \$6 each.

Ski Tracks – set it to snowshoeing for a simple display of real time and saved hiking stats.

Strava - trip recording app that allows sharing your data and photos with others

PeakFinder – identifies the peaks you might see on a summit. I use this one.
